UVA Chamber Singers

Founded in the spring of 2005 by faculty conductor Michael Slon, the UVA Chamber Singers is a select ensemble drawn from the University Singers (UVA's flagship chorus), and committed to broad programming perspectives, performs a wide variety of repertoire ranging from early music to contemporary compositions. In addition to a performance for the Governor and other distinguished guests at UVA's 2017 Bicentennial Cornerstone Celebration, performances have included Britten's *Hymn to St. Cecilia*, Purcell's *Dido & Aeneas* (with Three Notch'd Road Baroque ensemble), programs of Latin American choral music, choral music from film and Broadway, new music by Meredith Monk (performed with the Meredith Monk Vocal Ensemble), and a concert of campaign songs with the UVA Center for Politics and special guests including Martin Luther King III.

The ensemble's repertoire has also included: Byrd's Mass for 4 voices and Mass for 5 voices, Vivaldi's Gloria and Magnificat, Copland's In the Beginning, Allegri's Miserere, Whitacre's Five Hebrew Love Songs, Lauridsen's Mid-Winter Songs, Glass's Three Songs, Burtner's Palladian Echoes, and Bach's Mass in B minor and Orff's Carmina Burana with the University Singers. In addition, the group has performed popular standards by Harold Arlen, Jerome Kern, George Gershwin, and the Beatles, and a spoof concert with music of P.D.Q. Bach. Other collaborations include concerts with the Staunton Music Festival (including with Grammyaward winning baritone Kevin McMillan), Victory Hall Opera (in pioneering presentations of Poulenc and Gluck operas with deaf actors), the Charlottesville Chamber Music Festival (featuring Peteris Vasks' Plainscapes), and a 2022 presentation of Defiant Requiem (honoring the prisoners at Terezin who performed the Verdi Requiem) at the Strathmore Music Center with five other universities. They've sung in workshop with UVA Chamber Singers Peter Phillips and members of the Tallis Scholars, and in 2014, were honored to perform for composer Philip Glass. They've also been heard in major works, at VMEA, and on tour in the U.S. and Europe with the University Singers, including for Evensong with the Jesus College Choir at Cambridge University.

Michael Slon



Michael Slon is Director of Choral Music and Professor at the University of Virginia, where he leads the University Singers, UVA Chamber Singers, and also guest conducts the Charlottesville Symphony. He also serves as Music Director of the Oratorio Society of Virginia, and as conductor and chorusmaster with Charlottesville Opera. Having led the University Singers and Charlottesville Symphony in a gala performance for UVA's 2017 Bicentennial Launch Celebration

(which included Copland's *Appalachian Spring* with the Martha Graham Dance Company), he and the Singers presented the regional premiere of Leonard Bernstein's *Mass* at UVA in 2018. His UVA ensembles have also performed for composer Philip Glass and the creators of *Les Misérables*, toured Europe, Canada, and the United States, and received more than half a million views on social media platforms. Also active as a composer and writer, his first book – *Songs from the Hill* – has been cited in a variety of other publications, and his work on Leonard Bernstein has appeared in the Choral Journal, won the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) Julius Herford Prize, and appeared in *Bernstein in Context* (2024) from Cambridge University Press. He holds degrees from Cornell University and the Indiana University School of Music.



Deke Polifka



Deke Polifka is Director of Music at St. Paul's Memorial Church (Episcopal) on The Corner, where his duties include directing choirs for children and adults, serving as principal organist, and overseeing all aspects of the parish's music. Deke accompanies the University Singers and Chamber Choir at UVA, and

has enjoyed recent collaborations with The Oratorio Society of Virginia and The Virginia Consort. Previously, Deke served for eleven years as Organist and Choirmaster at Grace and St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Colorado Springs, and was Assistant Conductor and accompanist for The Colorado Vocal Arts Ensemble.

An active performer, he has presented organ recitals in venues such as the National Cathedral in Washington, DC, and has appeared with orchestra for performances of Barber's Toccata Festiva, the Poulenc Concerto and organ symphonies by Widor and Guilmant. Deke holds degrees in piano performance from The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, and earned an Artist Diploma in Organ Performance from The University of Denver. In 2013, he spent a summer sabbatical in France, playing many of the significant instruments in and around Paris and studying French organ repertoire with Marie-Louise Langlais. Deke is an Associate of the American Guild of Organists (AAGO) and has served in various leadership positions for that organization. He and his wife Joyce have three children and very much like spending time outdoors, cooking, and making music together.
